

## Actions & Consequences

45 Min Lecture, NCPD HS (Target audience 13-18yrs)

This presentation was designed for High School age students focusing on the increase in school threats. NCPD Homeland Security Police Officers outline the importance of reporting Suspicious Activity so that we can intervene at the point of inspiration rather than react to operation. The presentation will also highlight the potential consequences of making a threat to a school. The discussion will include the potential results of inappropriate social media posts and "Private" Chats / messages involving threats of violence. Students will learn that this type of behavior can impact college and job applications and, in some cases, lead to an arrest. Even instances intended to be "a Joke" have had lasting negative impacts on many individuals lives.
